CHEMO CAPS: This is our new project this year. I have a very easy pattern I will share at our leadership conferences. There is a real need for these.

QUILTS OF VALOR: These will be presented to deserving veterans at the State Convention. They need to be at least twin size, made of cotton, and red, white, and blue.
