Monday, February 2, 2025 (day 22 of the 90-day Session)

It was a very eventful week for the Washington State Grange at the legislature. Monday was our annual legislative day and we had over 50 Grangers cover the capitol campus for office visits, guest speakers, tours and overall advocacy.

Our guest speakers included Senate Agriculture Committee Chairman Mike Chapman (D), Senator Ron Muzzall (R), AWB Vice President Morgan Irwin and Parks and Recreation Commission director Brian Considine. They engaged the group on all topics from health care to agriculture and taxation to discover pass fees. Our members engaged in dozens of office visits with members from both sides of the isle and all corners of the state.

This week we got some welcome news that [HB 2431](#) - *Increasing the maximum annual limit for regularly scheduled fundraising activities for the nonprofit public assembly halls and meeting places property tax exemption* – Is being heard in House Finance committee on February 5th. After a positive hearing we look forward to getting this bill scheduled for an executive session before the fiscal cutoff on February 9th.

Next week we will see a flurry of policy bills being voted out of committee as Wednesday will be the final day for policy committee bills to be voted out of committee. On February 5th all eyes will turn to the fiscal committees which have to vote all bills out by the February 9th deadline.

How to Testify on Bills this Year

As a reminder you can easily participate in the lawmaking process by contacting your elected state representatives through online legislative tools.

Start here: <https://app.leg.wa.gov/csiremote/>

Select **House** or **Senate**

Committee: **Choose the committee where you bill is being heard**

Meetings: **Choose the date of the hearing**

Select the bill you want from the list.

Select:

I would like to submit written testimony.

I would like to testify live during the hearing.

I would like my position noted for the legislative record.

You may check to see who else has signed in to testify.

On the next screen, fill in all the blanks and submit.

You will receive an email with a link for the hearing. At the appropriate time, join the meeting and wait to be admitted.

When you are called to speak, introduce yourself and speak for 1-2 minutes.

To prepare, write down what you want to say. Read it aloud several times. Time yourself.
